## WHAT 4-YEAR COLLEGES CONSIDER

#### PRIMARY FACTORS

- High School Course Rigor
- Rank
- GPA/Grades
- SAT/ACT test scores

#### **ADDITIONAL FACTORS**

- Essay(s)- answer the question.
- (The best essays are often simple and personal)
- Extracurricular Activities
- Letters of Recommendation
- Demonstrated Interest



## COLLEGE ADMISSION TESTING

- Test at the end of Junior year and beginning of Senior year
- ACT www.actstudent.org Cost \$60
- SAT www.collegeboard.org Cost \$55
  - ▶ FREE on SAT School Day March 2, 2022
- Fee waivers available(free/reduced lunch students)
- Used for scholarships
- Not needed for community college (unless used as TSI replacement)
- Required for college or university admission(may require subject tests in addition to the regular SAT)

Official Test Scores—ACT or SAT*	• Interview



## TOP 10% ADMISSION POLICY

- Attend a recognized public or private high school in Texas
- Rank in the top 10% of their graduating class, and
- Ensure all required credentials and applications are received by the freshman closing date
- ONLY UT Austin has a different Top 10% policy
  - Top 6% for the Class of 2023



## OTHER WAYS YOU CAN BE ADMITTED

 Academic Admits – Class rank, SAT/ACT score, successfully taken all minimum required and recommended course work

Review Admits – Complete application file will be reviewed

 Transfer Admission – Complete required coursework through 2 year college (Pre-Admission Agreements)
